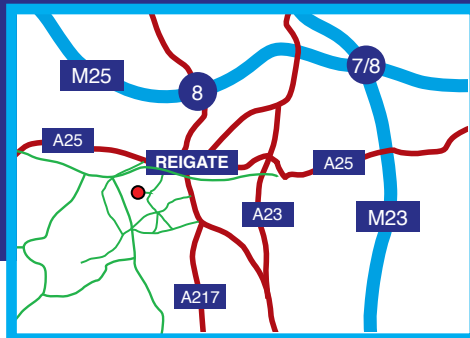

Hosting Residential Camps

Littleton Manor Equestrian has vast experience of hosting both Riding Club and Pony Club Camps and Events. In 2010 the Surrey Union Pony Club hosted their Midi Camp at LMEQ who have since gone on to host numerous annual residential camps for Pony Clubs and Riding Clubs from across the South East, in addition to events such as the Area 11 Pony Clubs Eventers' training days. In 2011 LMEQ was base for the British Endurance Team final trials before European Championships, whilst in 2012 LMEQ became a designated Pre-Games Training Camp for London 2012 being utilised by an Olympic Eventing Team and the Mexican Modern Pentathlete delegation. In 2015 and 2016 LMEQ hosted widely acclaimed British Eventing Horse Trials, whilst 2020 saw the inaugural Littleton Manor Hunter Trials and LMEQ's own Essential Eventing series.



LMEQ offers a state of the art cross country course, specifically designed for training and built by James Willis, course designer for the Badminton Grass Roots Championships and course builder to Badminton Horse Trials and Rio 2016 Olympics. The recently refurbished 50x60 show jumping arena offers a world class Equestrian Surfaces riding arena and complements the excellent adjacent international dressage arena which has also recently been resurfaced by Equestrian Surfaces. Beyond this there is the extensive gallop track, grass arena facilities and shower, toilet and catering facilities. That LMEQ is equipped with all these facilities in such close proximity to each other, makes it the perfect setting for residential camps and Riding Club and Pony Club events.

The Cross Country Course

LMEQ's Cross Country training course is, according to many of the riders who use it, 'Probably the best' grass course in the South East. Designed and built by Badminton course builders the Willis Bros., the 120 element course boasts a wide array of fences built with all levels of horse and rider in mind. The range of corners, skinny's, steps, combinations and inviting water complex caters for the less experienced horse and rider, as well as the most established pairings. Former European 3 Day Eventing champion, Olympian and LMEQ regular, Tina Cook (GBR) said 'All my horses, from my real youngsters right up to Miners Frolic have been around the course and all really benefitted from it'. The course is regularly changed by the Willis Bros and formed the centre piece of the 2015 and 2016 British Eventing Horse Trials. The course has recently been expanded to enable the Essentials Eventing and Hunter Trials series to run around the farm.



The Gallops

LMEQ's extensive gallops run between the picturesque fields and around the cross country training course. The surface, which had additional new Equestrian Surfaces surface added in 2020, is an all-weather gel-track, and can be used all year round. The gallops are enclosed by post and rail fences, making them ideal for the novice rider.

The Equestrian Surfaces Show Jumping Arena

The 50x60m Show Jumping arena has undergone significant refurbishment in 2020 with a new all weather waxed Equestrian Surfaces surface installed which provides brilliant support, response and performance in all weathers. The arena is equipped with a complete competition set of show jumps and a selection of portable cross country fences. The arena benefits from a viewing bank and judges box with commentary equipment.

The International Dressage Arena

The 20x60m International Dressage arena also benefitted from significant refurbishment in 2020. Like the Show Jumping Arena, it boasts an Equestrian Surfaces waxed surface. The arena also offers floodlights, training mirrors, power for a sound system and viewing bank. Local event rider Georgia Bale (GBR) said, 'I schooled my top horse in the new International Arena and found his dressage marks really improved –it's great to have so much space!' The Dressage and Show Jumping arenas link making the perfect combination for 'Competition' and 'Warm Up' arenas.



Grass Arena Facilities

For residential camps, a grass arena can be set up on LMEQ's free draining sandy soil. When not used as an arena, the area is also perfect for activities such as gymkhana, mounted games, musical rides and practicing for road tests. A full set of jumps can be supplied for the grass arena space.
